Empire	An extensive group of countries ruled over by a single monarch or state
Monopoly	A situation where there is no competition for trade
Imperialism	The policy of extending a country's power and influence through colonization
Nationalism	Supporting ones country above all else
Direct Rule	Part of an empire controlled by a single central government
Indirect Rule	Governed people retaining certain powers whilst controlled by another country
Trading Companies	Trading body for English Merchants to trade with other parts of the Empire
Colony	A country or area under full or partial control of another country
Decolonisation	The undoing of building a colony – granting previous parts of an empire independence
Push Factor	Something bad pushing you away from an area
Pull Factor	Something good encouraging you to move to an area
