
 Closed ended
 No confusion at the end – everything is answer and 'wrapped' up.

French for "the ending," the denouement is often happy if it's a comedy, and dark and sad if it's a tragedy.

Different Narrative Voices

First person narrator	First person narration (identified by the pronoun I) – the narrator participates in the story.			
Second person narrator	The reader is part of the story. The narrator describes the reader's actions, thoughts, and background using "you."			
Third person narrator	Third person narration (identified by pronouns such as he, she, they) – the narrator stands outside the story.			
Omniscient narrator	A narrator who knows what is happening at all times; knows the thoughts and feelings of all the characters in the story. Often linked to 3 rd person narrator.			
Intrusive narrator	Passes comment, evaluates, judges characters, situations and their responses			
Limited narrator	A story is told through one character's experience at a time. There can be multiple narrators or just one, but each perspective is limited to what the narrating character sees, hears, feels, knows Often linked to 1 st person narrator			
Singular	One narrative voice throughout

Propp studied 100 fairy tales in detail, he identified *seven archetypes*:



Ways the	<u>Outrageous hook</u>	Puzzling hook			
author can 'hook' the reader	This will make you do a double take, 'Did I really read that?'	This immediately makes you ask questions			
Quotation hook	<u>Startling hook</u>	Direct address hook			
This connects you with something you already know	This makes you think twice, but isn't outrageous.	You are spoken to directly			
Subtle hook <u>Atmospheric hook</u>		<u>Visual hook</u>			
Appeals to your sense of curiosity	Descriptive	Appeals to our sense of sight.			
<u>Funny hook</u>	Question hook	Direct speech hook			
Appeals to your sense of humour	You want to read on to find the answer.	Characters speaking
