Key Word	Definition
Genocide	A planned attempt to destroy an ethnic, racial, religious or national group.
Holocaust	Originates from the Greek word <i>holokausto</i> meaning 'a burnt sacrifice'. This is the term used in reference to the Nazi genocide of the Jewish community.
Ghetto	A part of a city, especially a slum area, occupied by a minority group or groups.
Concentration Camp	A place in which large numbers of people, especially political prisoners or members of persecuted minorities, are deliberately imprisoned in a relatively small area with inadequate facilities, sometimes to provide forced labour.
Death Camp	A camp with facilities for mass execution.
Resistance	The refusal to accept or comply with something; the attempt to prevent something by action or argument.


