

A Level Philosophy and Ethics Learning Journey

Mission Statement: This qualification is designed to develop a greater understanding and appreciation of the development of religious beliefs and teachings, as well as the disciplines of ethics and philosophy of religion. Learners will develop their skills of critical analysis in order to construct balanced, informed arguments and responses to religious, philosophical and ethical ideas. This is the subject that let's students pause and ask the really big questions, for example: 'what makes an action right or wrong?', 'what do we mean when we talk about truth and justice?'

A Level Philosophy and Ethics has three papers. The content is taught across both Beaminstor and Colfox. Beaminstor delivers Philosophy and some Christian Development. Colfox delivers Ethics and the remainder of Christian Development.
