MP Edward Morello debates with Students

Students enjoyed debating with their MP Edward Morello when he visited the school as part of UK Parliament Week.

More than 80 students, who hold Leadership Positions at Colfox, were invited to take part in the debate with Mr Morello MP, they also asked him many searching questions about issues facing young people in Dorset during a question-and-answer session.

Head Students Oliver and George (pictured above left) organised the debate, with Oliver proposing the notion 'the United Kingdom should make their own laws and not be subjected to matters of international law'. Opposing the notion, George successfully argued that international frameworks help defend rights and freedoms internationally. A show of hands showed many students agreed with George's opposition.

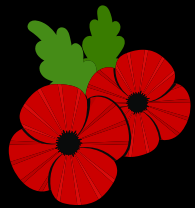
Students involved in one of the many leadership opportunities in the school, such as House Council, Sports Captains, Anti-Bullying and Rights-Respecting Ambassadors – were invited to attend. During the question-and-answer session, Year 11 Student and House Captain Spencer (pictured above right) asked an excellent question about the need for more affordable local housing, and Mr Morello gave an impassioned reply.



Head Student Oliver, in Year 12, said: “It was interesting to hear how Mr Morello got involved in politics, became an MP, his view on issues facing our community and how he plans to tackle vital issues like housing that affect local people. It was great to see students being invigorated and inspired by a charismatic political speaker, he really got across how important it is that more young people vote.”

Edward Morello MP said: “It was an absolute pleasure to meet with so many Colfox students. The debate was extremely well informed, and their questions were tough and well-considered. It was clear they had given considerable thought to the issues that affect them and their wider community. UK Parliament Week is a fantastic opportunity for students to engage with the political process and I’m grateful to the Sir John Colfox Academy for participating.”

Adam Teasdale, Head of Sixth Form and Personal Development, said: “As always, the students of Colfox were brilliant. They thought carefully about the debate and asked some excellent questions, including personal questions that were brave and eloquently delivered. Mr Morello gave some excellent advice to students who want to make a difference in our local community. Student Voice and empowering students to be leaders with the power to change things is valued at Colfox. We were proud to be the first secondary school in the southwest to achieve UNICEF’s ‘Gold’ Rights Respecting Schools Award – meaning students’ rights are valued and their voices are heard. I think Mr Morello was quite pleased to hear that Colfox students also chose to elect him in the summer, when we ran a Colfox general election to mirror the UK general election.”

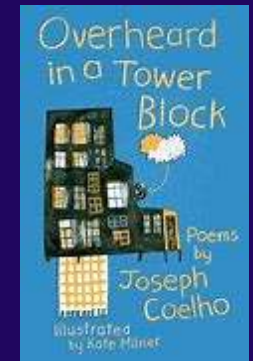
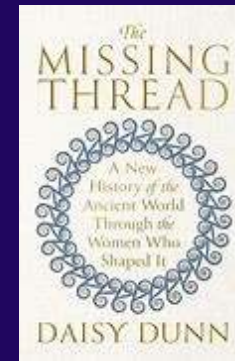
Bridport Literary Festival Comes to Colfox!



We were delighted to welcome Children's Laureate Joseph Coelho, Classicist Daisy Dunn, Poet Gill Barr, the public and primary schools to Colfox, as part of Bridport Literary Festival.

Students from Bridport Primary School, Burton Bradstock and St Mary's joined Year 7 Colfox students to hear a brilliant and engaging talk by outgoing Children's Laureate Mr Coelho. The invited schools are all part of the growing Initio Learning Trust, which Colfox is proud to be a part of. Students got the opportunity to hear Mr Coelho read his work 'Relic Hamilton and the Genie Hunter' and ask him lots of questions!

Daisy in Year 7 said, "His book is all about genies and genie hunters. The way he spoke about it made me want to read it. It sounded exciting and it was interesting to hear how he became a writer."



The public joined Colfox's Ancient History, Ancient Greek and Latin students for a talk by Classicist and acclaimed author Daisy Dunn, who gave a fascinating talk about her new book 'The Missing Thread, a New History of the Ancient World Through the Women Who Shaped it'.

Daisy said: "I so enjoyed speaking at the Sir John Colfox Academy, as part of the Bridport Literary Festival, the academy has launched a Classics Hub so pupils have the chance to learn Greek, Latin and Ancient History. This is brilliant news."

The Classics Hub at the Sir John Colfox Academy was launched last year in response to students' growing interest in studying the ancient world.

Millie in Year 10, said: "I really enjoyed the lecture, it was interesting to hear more about the lives of women in the ancient world. We got to ask Daisy questions and chat to her at the end, it was fascinating to hear about her book."

Poet, tutor and former Colfox English teacher Gill Barr held a brilliant poetry workshop for students interested in becoming writers. Gill said: "The students were a delight, friendly, engaged and with capacious imaginations!"

Inspiring Future Astronauts: A Space Adventure

I recently shared the wonders of space exploration with Year 9 and 10 students at Purbeck School. Through engaging hands-on activities, we delved into the exciting world of rockets and the challenges of asteroid collisions.

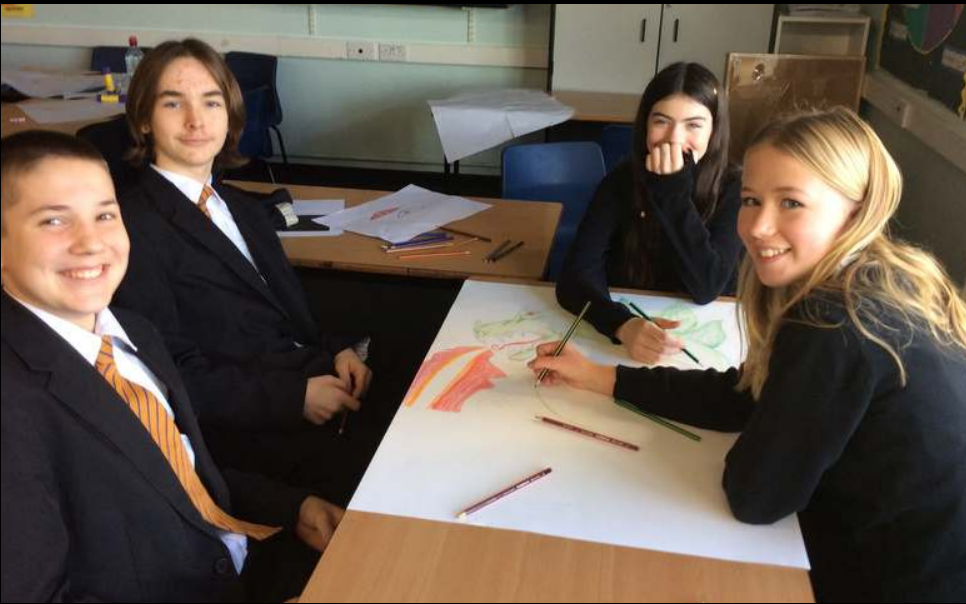
Students had the chance to design and launch their own pressure rockets, experiment with hydrogen-oxygen propulsion, and even try on a real Soviet Union astronaut helmet and spacesuit! A highlight of the event was the opportunity to touch a piece of the Moon, a 4.5 billion-year-old asteroid.

By exploring the origins and composition of asteroids, students gained a deeper understanding of our solar system and the potential threats they pose. With their rockets soaring to impressive heights, reaching a peak of 43 meters, these young minds were ignited with curiosity and a passion for science.

The sequence occurs frequently in Maths and in nature, where examples include branching of some trees, the arrangements of leaves on stems such as ferns and pinecones.

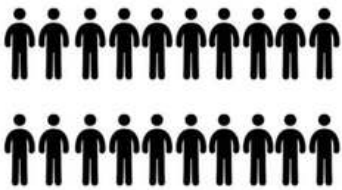

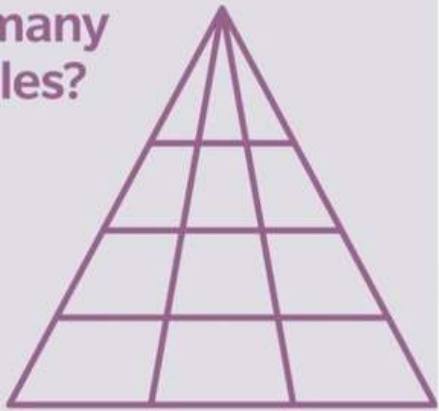

Colfox Christmas Reading

The fantastic speech below, which encapsulates the values of Colfox, was written and read at the Carol Concert by Oliver Chaning-Pearce, in Year 12:

Good evening, Ladies and Gentlemen, my name is Oliver Chaning-Pearce, and I'm in Year 12 at Colfox, thank you for having me here on behalf of the school to talk about Christmas and Colfox's impact on the wider community and world.

As we are midway through the Advent period, we all reflect on those that cannot celebrate Christmas to its full extent, both within and outside our country. Christmas is a time for celebration of new life, and God's love for humanity. These values that Christmas represents can and should be experienced by all. I am grateful to the organisations that help countless people across the world this Christmas time, funded by support from normal people. And I thank those normal people, including everyone sat in this church, that despite individual differences have contributed to helping others, be it the parents who donate part of their weekly shop, the volunteers in our community or the children who show unparalleled kindness to their fellow students at Colfox.

At Colfox, we understand that Christmas can bring a mix of emotions. For some of our students and their families, this time of year is incredibly difficult but despite the increasing hardships and challenges posed, our school, like our wider community persists and even grows to meet these challenges. Be it through pastoral support, Student Voice, or our library's commitment to give all young people an equal opportunity to read, Colfox is committed to nurturing not only academic growth but also character development.

By discussing the lessons of history, the power of empathy, and the significance of faith, we hope that, as the leaders of the future, we will avoid the mistakes of the past. And it is with these principles that the students at Colfox will forge an even brighter future.

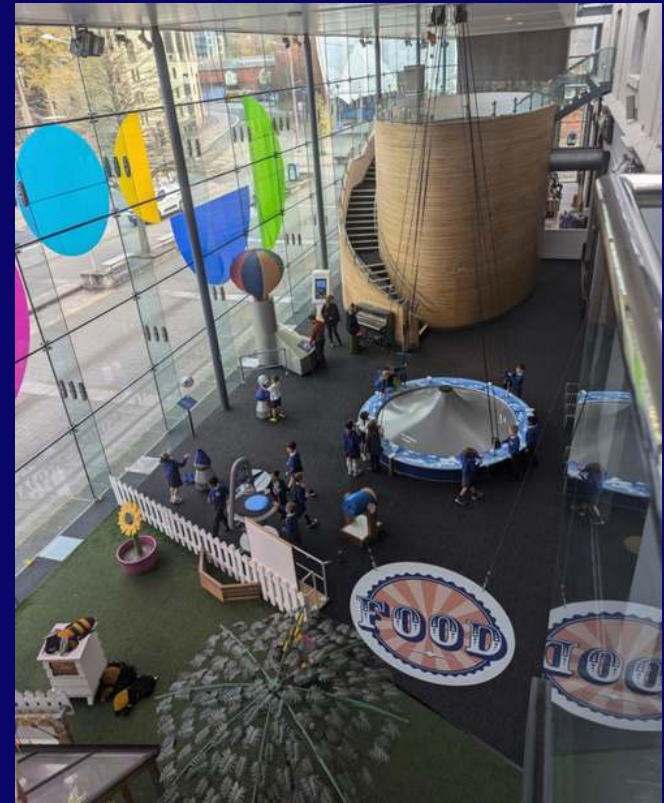
