You are invited to the 2020 Minerva Trust concert celebrating the rights that all children hold across the world. These rights were born out of the horror of two World Wars. The United Nations was formed after World War 2 in 1945 aiming for countries to come together to help heal the dreadful physical and emotional damage of war. All countries agreed a set of rights for the world's children and adults. UNICEF, the United Nations children's agency, created the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) The aim of this was to make sure all children are provided with support to grow well physically, emotionally, spiritually and academically.

Minerva Learning Trust schools have developed a concert of songs and words to demonstrate why understanding these rights is important to children and adults, and how this can lead to a growing sense of the need for us all to behave respectfully to each other.

In our schools our young people are regularly involved in fundraising for a range of charities that support those who struggle to have their rights met. For example, Red Nose Day helps charities that support families and children with mental health issues and children at home and abroad to survive and thrive. The concert celebrates these activities and how through reaching out with 'Helping Hands' we can all make a positive difference to our world through our actions.


